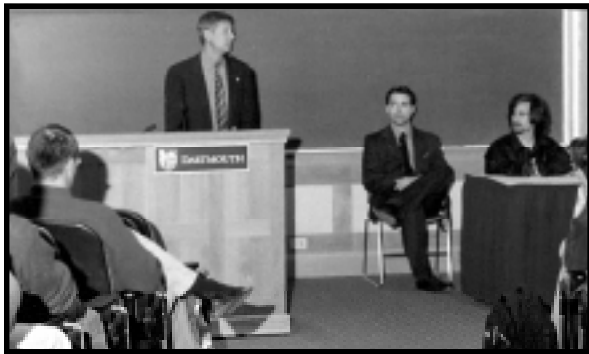

## Gary Johnson Slams Drug War at Dartmouth

*At High Noon, Sunday April 7th, on the Dartmouth College campus, Governor Gary Johnson spoke to a full auditorium on the realities of the War on Drugs.*

His speech was similar to the one given at the LPMA convention the previous evening. His message: the War on Drugs does not work.

The speech was sponsored by the Dartmouth Libertarians and Students for a Sensible Drug Policy.

The governor admitted to his past use of recreational drugs, how he does not condone or recommend drug use, but also competently explained the senselessness of the War on Drugs. Having been a marijuana user, he also has a real acceptance of Marijuana, and expressed how it should not be a Schedule 1 narcotic drug. There are no reported deaths or violent acts associated with marijuana. Whereas tobacco, alcohol and hard street drugs show high death or violence statistics.

One of his most staggering statistics is the non-violent drug arrest rate

in the USA. Each year 1.6 million people in the USA are arrested for drug-related offenses. This is almost the entire population of New Mexico and more than the entire popula-

tion of New Hampshire.

Johnson repeatedly acknowledged how the War on Drugs does not work. One of its major downfalls is how it keeps the cyclical action of crime and drug-related

diseases on the rise. His solutions: treatment centers, education programs, and regulated and available recreational drugs so that people know what they are getting.

One of the major problems they have found in NM is that whenever

## LPNH hosts L-Night

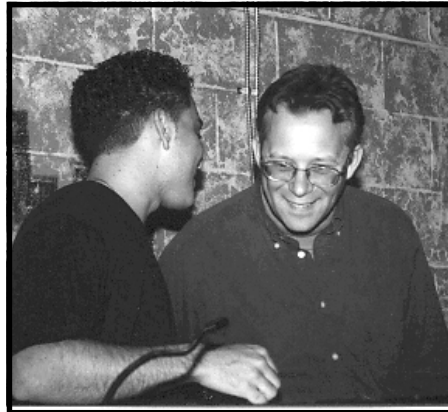

there is a large heroin bust, within days there are a large number of overdoses. Johnson explained this by stating that when you change a heroin addict's supply you have now changed the purity and quality of their drugs making them more susceptible to overdose.

Johnson has also worked towards making law enforcement become peace officers again. In NM, law enforcement now carry overdose kits. Often, police are the first on the scene of an overdose and in the past would stand and watch until medical personnel arrive. Now NM police officers actively work to save lives.

Governor Johnson is a role model to existing governors and aspiring governors on how to rationally approach drug use in this country.

Dartmouth student Robert Sutton said "the event was very well advertised and attended, especially for a Sunday morning. He got a lot of laughs, especially for his "don't do sugar" remarks, and even I learned some new things (e.g. Ecstasy was patented by Merck in 1912). The Dartmouth Libertarians got some major exposure, and our mailing list quadrupled."

# Make War on the War on Drugs

The title of the article says it all. If anyone were able put their finger on the general theme of Governor Gary Johnson's speech at Dartmouth College recently, it would be "Make War on the War on Drugs". The drug war needs to end and end soon. The longer it drags out the worse our society becomes.

During Gov. Johnson's speech at Dartmouth on Sunday April 7th, he covered many important topics. All of which are very important areas of concern in America and around the world these days. One of the most relevant topics, in my view, is the ridiculous stance the Bush administration has taken with regard to drugs and terrorists.

## One simple reason

The claim is drug money somehow funds terrorist activities. If that were really true, the reason for terrorist involvement with the drug trade would be one simple reason: money. Why? Because the very "War on Drugs" makes drug profits 17,000% greater than they would be if they were regulated. Who wouldn't want a 17,000% return on investment? The same situation held true during alcohol prohibition. As long as it was outlawed, it was the outlaws who profited. Which in turn gave them the means to corrupt the police, judiciary, and even the government itself. Not to mention the havoc they created within our society.

The same holds true for drugs, and Gary Johnson makes a great argument for adopting the same model for drugs that currently regulates alcohol. We no longer have moonshiners and bootleggers sell-

ing alcohol on the street corner. Now we have drug dealers, gangs, drive-by shootings for territory to sell drugs (the same was done during alcohol prohibition), organized crime, cartels, corrupt governments, and terrorists. The situation's the same. The only thing that's changed are most of the players and the chemicals they fight over.

## Focus on true funding

If we want to focus on the true funding terrorists receive, we all have to take a long hard look in the



mirror. For it's not those who use drugs that fund terror, it's all of us who use OIL!

We know this to be true because the terrorists who seek to destroy us do so with the money given to them from the Middle East countries that sell us oil, not drugs. Most drugs are grown in South America and Asia. If you remember, during the rule of the Taliban poppy growing was outlawed and heroin coming from the Middle East nearly stopped. However, now that the Taliban is gone, the Afghan farmers are once again growing poppies, harvesting heroin, and the U.S. has

publically stated they won't try and stop it.

Governor Johnson pointed out a great irony. During alcohol prohibition we had Al Capone, and with drug prohibition we have Osama. That's if you buy the propaganda Drug Czar John Walters is selling in order to expand the drug war even further.

In other great insights to this modern problem Gary Johnson talks about the great amount of resources wasted in rounding up and incarcerating simple marijuana smokers. Out of the 1.6 million people arrested each year for drug related offenses, 3/4 are for simple marijuana possession.

## "Protect and Serve"

Our law enforcement needs to focus on "Protect and Serve" by focusing on violent people such as murderers, rapists, batterers, and now terrorists. "Locking people up for smoking marijuana in the confines of their own home, hurting no one arguably other than themselves is a crime" says Johnson. He went further to ask, "Where will it end? Will we start arresting people for eating hamburgers, if one day the government decides they're to unhealthy? I hope not."

**The title of the article says it all.**

# 2002 Election Update

## Declaration Deadline

Candidates for office must file their Declarations of Intent between June 5 & June 14. State Rep candidates can file a Declaration with their Town/City Clerk. All other candidates (and State Rep candidates on the last day) must file their Declaration with the Secretary of State's office (open until 5PM).

You can still petition after that, until early August, but if you don't declare, you won't be on the ballot.

## Petitioning Update

We are still collecting petitions across the state. Despite the heroic efforts of candidates and activists, we're still only half-way to our goal. There are no more local elections, which are the best opportunities to reach registered voters, but candidates and volunteers are still going to special events, the town dump and other locations, picking up 10-50 signatures at a time until we reach the 5000 raw petitions we need for certification. A big thank you to everyone who's collected so far.

To the rest of the membership: get out there and help! The candidates cannot do this by themselves. Every petition you get brings us closer to our goal.

## Where We Need Help

So far, a majority of the petitions have been collected in the 2nd Congressional district, that means those of you in the Seacoast area, plus Carrol and Belknap counties need to get out there and collect for Dan Belforti.

Richard Kahn's effort to get on the ballot for Executive Council #4 is also lagging. He still needs 600 signatures from Hudson, Bedford, Hookset, Raymond, Derry and other nearby towns.

We would like more members

to run for State Senate and Executive Council seats so voters all across the state will have as many Libertarian candidates to vote for as possible. Those higher offices also have a wider petitioning area so more people can collect for you while they collect their own signatures.

## What To Do

If you want to be on the ballot, you'll have to average three signatures per day until August if you're starting now. Collect 12-15 signatures a day and you'll be done in just two weeks. Remember to file your Declaration of Intent with your Town Clerk in June.

Please check <[www.lpn.org](http://www.lpn.org)> for new petitions, updates, instructions and a FAQ, or contact Howard Wilson for help. As more Libertarian candidates come forward, more petitions will be posted. According to the Secretary of State's Office, "You must put your full name and domicile on petitions and the office as in 'State Representative' and the county and district."

If you want to be a candidate for office, notify Howard Wilson or Rich Tomasso so they can get a petition to you with your name on it.

## The Process Is Simple

Ask each prospective signer if he or she is a registered voter in NH. Then ask if they'll sign the petition to place the listed candidates on the ballot in November. Their mailing address is optional if it's the same as their domicile.

Remember, we're not asking for a vote, just a chance to run for office. Telling people the State is making us do this seemed to be effective at times.

You can collect petition signatures just about anywhere (get per-

mission to collect them on private property): outside city hall, in front of stores, the town landfill, at fairs, political events, school-board meetings, gun shows, neighborhood meetings, OPH booths and old-fashioned door-to-door (which is also great outreach if you're a candidate or working on a campaign).

We're planning on having a party or other celebration for everyone who collects petitions sometime later this year, probably after certification.

## Petitioning Coordinators

To help our petitioning efforts, we're asking one member from each city and town to be the coordinator for the petitioning effort for your area. It's an easy job. You just agree to do some petitioning and collect all the petitions from your city or town and bring them to the town clerk for certification and pick them up and send them to Howard Wilson so they can all be turned in at the Secretary of State's office in August.

# Liberty in Motion

**We're facing an uphill battle right now and need to redouble our efforts.**

The LP of Massachusetts held its annual convention on April 6th. A sizeable contingent from New Hampshire was there including most of the executive board and several of our candidates and activists. A good time was had by all. Many contacts were made and great ideas were exchanged.

Sharon Harris led off with the morning keynote "Liberty in Motion" which covered the current state of the patriot and freedom movements against the growing tide of pro-government sentiment since 9/11. We're facing an uphill battle right now and need to redouble our efforts if we want to see liberty moving forward again. The movement as a whole is growing worldwide, but so are the threats to liberty, from the Drug War to the new police powers in the Patriot Act.

"Libertarians are the only people who have the answer," Harris said, "We're now talking about life and death. We are the true patriots, and that's what we need to make clear — that we have the ideas to save America and save the world."

Dr John Lott discussed "More Guns, Less Crime" at lunch. He mentioned the lopsided reporting by the media on crimes involving guns, particularly the lack of reporting on when a gun stops a crime.

He covered the state of gun ownership in America and Israel, which has seen a dramatic increase in the number of gun permits in the last six months. Israel is also an interesting case because in response to terrorist attacks the government made it easier for citizens to own guns and even encouraged it. Several terrorist attacks have been stopped by armed citizens, including a grandmother who snuck behind a ter-

rorist and put two shots in the back of his head.

There were a number of breakout sessions in the afternoon covering: communication skills, libertarian solutions, town committees, candidate workshops and firearms. NH members attended most these and came away with good information.

After the sessions, we gathered to share what we'd heard, discussed the campaigns and future plans for the party and for our convention in September.

Governor Gary Johnson of New Mexico received a warm welcome after dinner. His speech covered his idea of government in general, his own career and of course, the War on Drugs. Gov Johnson was able to get several reforms passed in NM, most notably requiring a guilty verdict for asset forfeiture. Gov. Johnson has also vetoed over 700 bills, more than all other sitting governors combined.

According to Johnson, several major politicians have said in private that the Drug War is futile but are afraid to say so publicly for what it might do to their careers. Johnson is term-limited so doesn't have to worry about it. Hopefully his courage on the issue will inspire others.

When asked if he'd run for president on our ticket, his answer was no. He believes he could do more to show the failure of the Drug War running as a Republican, but if that were to change, who knows.
