Helping Hands for Local Candidates

We're still looking for more candidates for city elections this fall to add to our three victories this year. We'll have even more time to help and promote city candidates. The filing deadline will be upon us soon.

So far we have James Maynard and Michelle Otterson running for City Council in Keene, plus Howie Howe running for Mayor in Manchester. We also have libertarians exploring runs for office in Dover, Keene, Lebanon, Manchester, Nashua and elsewhere. We will be making announcements here as the campaigns become official.

Check with your city clerk's office for details on filing requirements. Nashua has over 60 elected offices, and Manchester has more than 90, about half of which are unopposed, and some were won by write-ins. Plenty of opportunities for the hundreds of libertarians living there.

Goal: 20 candidates

To that end, the LPNH is having a "Helping Hands" election drive. Our minimum goal is to have 20 candidates, two from each county, to run for local office this year. Each candidate would be there to help the other, and the LPNH will also help each candidate in his or her quest for elected office.

If you do run, the LPNH will help you set up and plan your campaign, provide guidance, help with volunteers, financial support, press contacts, and give you a free web site with hosting.

If we reach our goal of 20 candidates for November, and win 3/4 of the races, we will raise our number of

elected officials by 50%. Even if we only win half of our races, we will increase our number by 33%.

Plan is achievable

Given the nature of local elections, this plan is very achievable. All the races are non-partisan, so there's no Party label to discourage voters. We just need you to run for office. We also need more volunteers to help these campaigns.

The LPNH is the most successful state LP in the country, with the most Libertarians per capita in elected or appointed office. We stand poised to make stunning wins and further our lead. But we need your help, and in turn, we

can help you, and you can help your community.

Important decisions

Local government is where most of the important decisions affecting the day-to-day lives of the people of New Hampshire are made. Maybe you want to overturn a burdensome zoning ordinance. Perhaps you are tired of high property taxes. Maybe you want to see change in your local school district. Or possibly there is another issue which you wish to see addressed. We can address that issue together and win.

Success begins at the bottom in politics. Local races can have a great impact on the lives of our fellow citizens. They are manageable, meaningful and most importantly winnable races.

Let's get people into local office to build the momentum to win majorities and start creating more freedom here in the Granite State this year. Let's show people that Libertarian government works. Let's show the rest of the country that Libertarians can win and govern in NH.

Governor Benson Joins as a Friend of the Free State Project

Despite the extraordinary demands on his time from lawmakers, media, aides, counsel and cheering taxpayers, Governor Craig Benson met with Free State Project (FSP) members visiting from nine other states to explore New Hampshire as a possible choice for the FSP. Benson welcomed the visit and noted that he had much in common with

Free Staters. After careful consideration, Governor Benson signed on as a Friend of the FSP. While making no commitment to move with the Free Staters, he supports their efforts to reform state and local government in order to create a truly free society.

The FSP (www.FreeStateProject.org) is a non-profit organization that is in the process of gathering 20,000 or more liberty-oriented people to move to a single state in the U.S. in the attempt to establish a truly free society. The success of the FSP would likely entail reductions in burdensome taxation and regulation, legal reforms, and an increased respect for and protection of people's rights, demonstrating the benefits of liberty to the rest of the nation and the world.

Jason Sorens, founder of the FSP, said "As a grassroots organization, we draw support from many quarters. In addition to the 5,000 members and hundreds of friends, it's wonderful to have an ally in the state's highest office."

The meeting, part of the "Escape to New Hampshire" getaway sponsored by the Welcome to the Granite State Committee (www.FreeStateNH.com), was arranged by John Babiarz, FSP member, Chair of the LPNH, and Benson's appointee to the Efficiency in Government Commission.

When FSP member Keith Murphy asked how he would feel about 20,000

small-government activists moving to New Hampshire, Benson replied, "Come on up. We'd love to have you." Amanda Phillips followed up by inviting Governor Benson to join the FSP as a Friend.

Important to Free Staters

Toward the end of the conversation, Benson said the next two items on his agenda are a Taxpayer Bill of Rights and school choice. Both of these are very important to Free Staters.

Elizabeth McKinstry, VP of the FSP said, "It's really impressive to see someone in political office who is encouraged, rather than threatened, by people who want to have a say in how government should be run."

In addition to Craig Benson being a Friend, two NH state representatives are FSP members, and others have expressed agreement with its goals. Henry McElroy (R-Nashua) commented, "The FSP represents a reaffirmation by the people that they want to be actively involved in the political process. That's why New Hampshire established a 400-seat legislature; each community wanted a voice in the state house. Since we have great representation already, let's start it here. Our state offers many opportunities for active participation. We would like to build the first Free State and help it spread to other states."

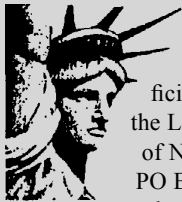

Report from Escape to New Hampshire

First, a huge thank you to everyone who came. It was great to meet so many people from across the country who came to see our beautiful state. Everyone on the Board and the Welcome Committee had a great time, thanks mostly to all of the Porcupines who came to visit and provide friendship, laughs and ideas. It would not have been the same without all of you. Hopefully we'll all get to see each other again soon.

People came from 22 states and Canada for nine days of fun and learning. We had activities every day from speeches and BBQs to historic and sightseeing tours. Other events were spontaneously organized from trips to local parks and swimming holes, to real estate prospecting.

Several Libertarian VIPs were there including: Michael Badnarik, Don Gorman, Spear Lancaster, Gary Nolan, George Phillies and Bonnie Scott. The Concord Monitor and NHPR were there to report on events.

Saturday, June 21st

It may have been the longest day of the year, but half the attendees were up well past midnight talking, playing cards, sharing a drink (or three), laughing, and telling stories. NH and VT residents were asked how local politics worked and what local life was like. Tim Condon polled the attendees for what states they liked and what issues mattered most to them. We planned for the future in the Free State, worked on campaign strategies, shared philosophies of life and generally had a lot of fun.

Sunday, June 22nd

We opened with John Babiarz talking about the advantages of NH – political, social and economic. Elizabeth McKinstry spoke on “Liberty and the Human Potential,” putting a softer side to the general libertarian message. She said we need to talk about the positives of a free world and less about the negatives of the current situation. She said liberty is about freedom from limitations on our actions and how much we can accomplish if we’re

simply given all the information and tools we need.

Dianne Gilbert of the NH Center for Constitutional Studies gave a presentation on “The Headless 4th Branch of Government”. She spoke of the undying bureaucracy controlling our government and the patient forces at work subverting our republic and our liberty. She gave examples of agencies and outlined the policies of Marxism we are fighting. When asked if there would be resistance to the Porcupines coming to NH, she replied “just come and do it,” which elicited laughter and cheers from the crowd. She predicted that if the FSP makes up 3% of the population of NH, those 3% would train 3% who would train 3% and so on. She was confident of success for the FSP if NH were chosen as its home.

Tim Condon spoke of why NH should make a great choice for the Free State. He admitted his previous prejudice about total population being the end-all factor, but when he took off those blinders he saw how NH shined like a beacon for the FSP. We rate #1 in low crime and high livability. For the economic and political criteria, NH ranks in the top 3 in 10 out of 12 categories in the FSP database. No other state even comes close. Plus, “what’s not to like about a state who’s motto is Live Free or Die?” Although he was careful to point out that he is not saying what his favorite state is, he does realize the great benefits and advantages of NH. He closed his talk by appealing for unity in the FSP, stating that “from sea to shining sea, liberty can be ours if we just hang together.”

Michael Badnarik, Libertarian candidate for president and an FSP member for several months, said

that the spirit of a place and movement is very important. He thanked a NH libertarian for loaning him a pistol since he couldn’t take one on the plane. “We’re trying to do the 2nd American Revolution without bloodshed... It will be necessary to take over government so it has to be a small government so there’ll be less people to displace and replace.” (NH comes up #1 in smallest state gov’t.) Taking over a state solves half the problem. He pointed out we need to take our children back. In 1953 the USA ranked #1 in math and science. In the 50 years of increased federal involvement we’re now #21.

Gary Nolan, another Libertarian presidential hopeful, spoke of what a beautiful state this is. We have no need to fight an income or sales tax. He said he’ll move within a month after the FSP vote. He predicted that once the Free State gets started, other states will have to compete or lose jobs and businesses and their brightest citizens. Once that happens, the snowball effect will take over. Gary also joined the FSP at Escape. Welcome aboard!

Next was a forum on NH politics hosted by Don Gorman, John Babiarz, James Maynard and Rich Tomasso. They outlined why NH is the best place to win local office, the sheer number of races means every libertarian and constitutionalist could be an elected official if they want. They talked about what the LPNH has learned, the impact we’ve had, how the political environment works and how to make friends. They answered questions and shared fun stories of the campaign trail and success stories from being elected to the good things that can happen from running a professional and civil campaign, such as being appointed to a commission or board.

After the forum we got an example of instant run off voting, which is similar (but not identical) to the Condorcet method. We held a vote of the assembled Porcupines for their state of choice, by having people stand in corners of the room to “vote.” For fairness, we decided not to include NH. The vote had 4 western states as choices: Alaska, Idaho, Montana and Wyoming. The

vote was close, but MT was eliminated in the first round. Next, WY lost by a few votes, as the ID and AK supporters, only one vote separating them, started shouting out the benefits of their states ("We have jobs!", "We have coastline!", etc) as the WY supporters walked to either corner to vote their preference. In the end, Idaho pulled out a narrow win.

Several groups had outreach tables for the entire day. Represented were the NHCCS, the Gun Owners of NH, Jail4Judges, Liberty Dollars, The Merrimack valley seekers, the Second Amendment Sisters, and the LPNH. We'd like to thank them again for attending.

We rounded out the day with a BBQ. Members took turns at the grill and in the kitchen. During the break beforehand, a few Porcupines were seen taking naps, others sought out the advice of locals for good places to live and work.

Sunday night was one of many campfires, even more camaraderie, the sharing of much libation, discussion of technology, politics, composing haiku, planning for the future and much laughter. Some conversations continued to sunrise.

Monday, June 23rd

Monday was a late start for many of us. A "gourmet" breakfast was served at one campsite, and attendees helped each other pack up. A Free State information tent was set up by Keith Murphy and Dave Mincin. Several folks went on a tour of the local attractions.

During the Week

Locals served as native resources and guides to out of staters on the laws, land, history and people of NH. Mike Lorrey took a number of people on a tour of the remote north country where they were able to photo moose and deer in their native environment, do a little shooting, browse various types of real estate for pricing and features, and swim in what he regards as the finest swimming hole in the state.

Party chair John Babiarz was there every day to meet and talk with members. Other Executive Board members attended for at least a few days.

Friday, June 27th

We arranged for a tour of the State House, followed by a special private meeting with Governor Benson. Please see the accompanying article and web reports for how well this event went.

Saturday, June 28th

We had a special "Freedom Networking" day to give various groups and vendors a chance to meet the Porcupines. We had many of the same groups from the prior weekend, plus several new attendees.

John Barnes hosted a Constitutional Colloquium at the nearby hospitality house in Jefferson. That evening we hosted a cocktail party and a large cookout to celebrate a week of fun and friendship. Plus a fireworks show in full view of Mount Washington.

In the words of Jack Shimek, a vendor who attended both weekends, "the Saturday night party was a rock 'em sock 'em good time. The party was right in view of Mt. Washington and the fireworks were good, the beer cold, the campfire hot and everybody just laughed and had a good time."

There is too much, let me sum up. In short, Escape was probably one of the best freedom-oriented events ever. A week of fun, learning, new friends and a vision of a bright future. Immediate friendships

were made which will last for years to come. People attended from as far away as Georgia and Vancouver. We started networking and planning. Several attendees were won over by the NH's beauty and hospitality. Some of us are already planning our next big social gathering. Even if we don't succeed politically as fast as we want, the Free State will be the most fun place in the country to be if you're a libertarian.

On a more personal note, at least one romance blossomed at Escape. Hardy from VT and Bonnie from NY found happiness in each other's company and after Escape went on a cross-country road trip together to the LNC meeting in Seattle. Upon returning to Hardy's home in VT, the couple got engaged. No word yet on the big date, but we'd like to think we had some small part in bringing these two together.

We received lots of press coverage: Union Leader, Associated Press, Nashua Telegraph, Concord Monitor, WGIR, NHPR, Taxpayer Radio, several local radio stations, WNDS TV-50, and many more media outlets covered the Escape. The NHPR report aired again nationwide on NPR.

Arbitration Association in the 70s. His LP work includes being a fund raiser and road manager for the '84 LP Presidential candidate, and seeking the nomination himself in 1992. He ran for the U.S. Senate in '92 and '94 in California, and for Congress in 2000, and served as Chair the Orange County LP 1996-1998. He was the Press Secretary for the Steve Kubby campaign in '98.

Boddie is the President and Founder of The Motivators, a professional speakers bureau in Huntington Beach, is also an adjunct professor in Political Science and History at Coastline Community College in Costa Mesa and Garden Grove, California.

We are finalizing our afternoon program, and it will include a candidate workshop. At the afternoon

business meeting we will be holding elections for the Executive Board, voting on resolutions, party constitution and bylaws changes, and nominating our 2004 candidates for governor, Congress, state and county offices and presidential electors.

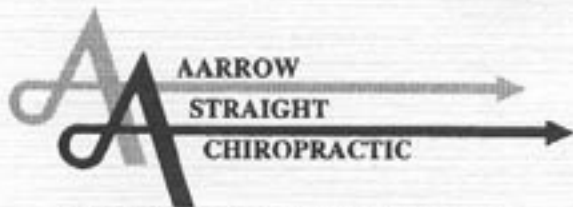

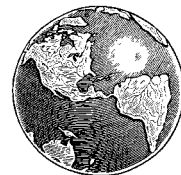
